Chancellor's Advisory Committee on Sustainability

The charge to this committee is to **guide and support** UCSF's efforts to:

- Annually examine UCSF's effect on the environment from a comprehensive perspective
- Evaluate existing UCSF policies, procedures and/or programs that affect the environment
- Serve as a coordinating body for groups or individuals concerned with sustainability issues at UCSF
- Establish priorities to accomplish UCSF's sustainability goals
- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions to 1990 levels by 2020
- Efficiently use and conserve water, energy and other resources
- Implement ecological transportation alternatives
- Develop environmentally responsible purchasing practices
- Develop healthy indoor air quality systems
- Minimize solid waste production
- Incorporate lifecycle impact into sustainable financial planning and budget goals
- Integrate environmental literacy into research, education and communication
- Promote environmentally responsible principles for faculty, staff and student behavior
- Implement resource-efficient site planning, design and building principles
- Require environmentally sound practices for hazardous material handling
- Conduct/promote sustainability activities among departments and operations in an integrated, interdependent manner
